

PUBLIC NOTICE

STREET REHABILITATION

Dear Property Owners/Residents:

The City of Elizabeth City will be performing pavement rehabilitation of certain streets within the City, including the streets as listed below. The streets will be resurfaced and/or reconstructed with asphalt concrete. Work is scheduled to begin Friday, March 04, 2022 through Friday April 1, 2022.

Milling of the streets below starts Friday, March 04, 2022 with paving of streets to start (including B Street) on Saturday March, 05, 2022

Project 1

- Hunter Street, from Riverside Avenue to Jones Avenue;
- Morgan Street, from Jones Avenue to Tuscarora Avenue;
- Park Street, from Hunter Street to Butlers Lane;
- Park Street, from Harris Drive to Wareham Street;
- Carolina Avenue, from Raleigh Street to Flora Street;
- Jones Avenue, from Agawam Street to Wareham Street;
- B Street, from Goodwin Avenue to Herrington Road;

Work will resume on the following streets Monday, March 7th, 2022

Project 1 Continued

- Lincoln Street, from Price Street to Moore Street;
- Butlers Lane, from Park Street to Tuscarora Avenue;
- Shirley Street, from Baxter Street to Church Street;
- East Burgess Street, from Poindexter Street to Second Street;
- Madison Street, from Ray Street to Laurel Avenue;
- Hull Drive, from Ehringhaus Street to Corsair Circle;
- Hyman Circle, entire length; and
- Cypress Street, from Parsonage Street to Harney.

During construction, it will be necessary to close the street partially or completely to vehicular traffic during construction work hours due to safety concerns. No street closure is expected to last more than 12 hours at a time. Street parking will also be restricted. "No Parking" signs may be posted along your street and enforceable by the Police Department. All other parking restrictions, including no parking for street cleaning, will still be in effect. Residents should know that access to their driveways may be prohibited for most of the day during the paving operations. If you plan to drive your vehicle while rehabilitation is scheduled in your area, please park it outside the construction area to avoid oil spray or other complications. Please note that the oil and asphalt used during construction is not easily removed from feet, shoes, floors and rugs.

The work is expected to be completed around (approximate time will be supplied), barring unforeseen problems and weather conditions. Construction in your vicinity may not take place in one continuous time period as there are several phases of construction. It also may not extend for the entire period between (approximate time will be supplied). The contractor will complete the concrete work (such as installing curb ramps, etc.) after undertaking pavement work. Except for special circumstances, normal work hours will be between 7:30 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday.

A City designee will be on site during work hours if you have any problems contact Public Works at 252-337-6628. The street rehabilitation may cause temporary inconvenience because of the nature of work. We will appreciate your patience during this period and will attempt to minimize the inconvenience.
