Community Development:

Last Friday, the Community Development Department officially received the site plan submittal for a 6,049 square foot WaWa gas station and convenience store to be located at 406 Halstead Boulevard. The parcel is approximately 1.85 acres and is zoned General Business (GB). The plan also includes 48 parking spaces, gas pump islands, sidewalk installation along Ehringhaus and Halstead for the entire length of the site, a new landscaping plan, and driveway improvements as approved by NC DOT. This site plan is heading for official technical review in the coming weeks.
